
Prioritizing Words to Address from a Text



Core Big Ideas

· In CA, identify additional academic words that are not included in the text that students will need to discuss characters, issues, and themes.

Important to Know and Do

- Choose high-use words that students are likely to encounter in materials across subject areas and grade levels. AWL (Academic Word List) is one resource.
- Words from the text that are important to understanding the gist.
- Words from the CA discipline that are essential for students to have precise vocabulary needed at their grade level.
- Consider words that have multiple meanings to determine if there is a new academic meaning students will need in addition to their more familiar one.

Worth Being Familiar With

 Words that students know that can help them connect their prior knowledge to the current new learning.

Don't Spend Time With

 Rare, unusual, or interesting word with the more sophisticated reader, while neglecting central lesson terms and high-use words that are vital for less proficient readers to comprehend and discuss and write about the content.
